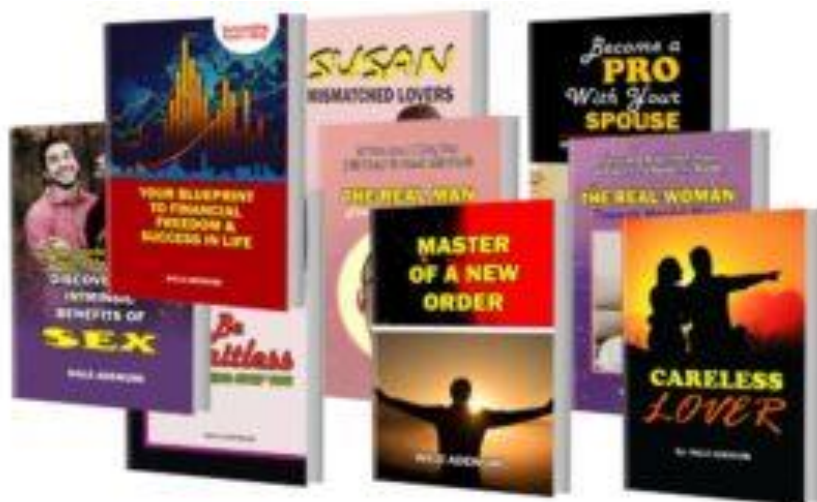

## INTRODUCTION TO VALUE-CENTRIC LEADERSHIP COURSE

**Subtitle: Foundation of Godly Leadership - Leading with Character, Godliness, and Purpose**

### Introduction:

The world has seen men and women rise to great heights, only to crash because they lacked the character to sustain their position. We learn through both history and scripture that a lack of integrity, discipline, and spiritual fortitude can bring even the most anointed down.

### Foundational Scripture:

*"Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things."*

— Philippians 4:8 (KJV)

### Biblical Examples: Lessons from the Rise and Fall of Leaders

- **Adam and Eve** – Called to steward creation, but they fell through disobedience. (*Genesis 3*)
- **Esau** – Sold his birthright for a temporary appetite. (*Genesis 25:29–34*)
- **Reuben** – Lost his firstborn rights due to instability and lack of discipline. (*Genesis 49:3–4*)
- **Balaam** – Gifted but corrupted by greed. (*Numbers 22–24, 31:8*)
- **King Saul** – Anointed but lost his throne due to disobedience. (*1 Samuel 15*)

- **Judas Iscariot** – Chosen as a disciple but fell due to love of money. (*Matthew 26:14–16; 27:3–5*)

These men started strong but ended weak because they failed to carry godly values. Your gift and calling can take you to the top, but only character will keep you there.

#### **Model Biblical Leaders to Emulate:**

- **Joseph** – A man of integrity who ruled Egypt. (*Genesis 39–41*)
- **Daniel** – Distinguished by excellent spirit and faithfulness. (*Daniel 6:3–5*)
- **David** – A man after God’s heart who valued repentance and worship. (*Acts 13:22*)
- **Peter** – Redeemed from failure and stood as a pillar of the early Church. (*John 21:15–17; Acts 2*)

#### **Course Activities:**

1. **Character Reflection Journal**  
Write down three areas in your life where you need to grow in godly character. Use Philippians 4:8 as a guide. Pray and set action steps.
2. **Biblical Leader Comparison**  
Choose two leaders from scripture—one who succeeded and one who fell. Write a short comparison on how character played a role in their outcomes.
3. **Accountability Partner**  
Pair with another participant to discuss weekly how you’re living out godly values in your leadership journey.
4. **Prayer & Listening Retreat**  
Dedicate time to seek God’s voice about the character He wants to shape in you. Journal what you hear and share it in your group session.
5. **Obedience Challenge**  
Choose one instruction from God or His Word you’ve delayed in obeying. Take a step this week to fully obey it.

#### **Final Thoughts:**

No matter how high we rise, if we abandon the voice of God and the values He instills, we will come crashing down like a projectile that falls from the sky. Water always finds its level—and in life, we will rise or fall to the level of our virtues.

**SELFLESS LEADERSHIP – CASE STUDY: TIMOTHY**

***Living Beyond Gain, Leading by Sacrifice***

***Introduction:***

Christianity will rise on the wings of sacrifice or fall beneath the weight of indulgence. Leadership, true leadership, is anchored on the altar of sacrifice—not self-gratification. Every generation has its heroes—not born great, but made through sacrificial choices.

As we recently received approval to run a *FREE leadership programme in state schools*, we encountered a surprise—no sponsorship, no funding. Yet, we pressed on. A principal remarked, “You must be millionaires.” No—we are grace-powered people living sacrificially.

***The Principle of Sacrifice:***

The faith handed down to us was built on the blood, sweat and prayers of those who came before us. The early missionaries were not celebrities; they were servants. Their names live today because they lived for a cause greater than themselves.

***Historical Examples of Sacrificial Leaders:***

1. **David Livingstone, Mary Slessor, John G. Lake**  
They left the comforts of Europe and came to Africa, many never returned. Their legacy lives on because of what they gave, not what they gained.
2. **Mother Teresa of Calcutta**  
From obscurity to global honour through her relentless service to the destitute.
3. **Nelson Mandela**  
From prison to presidency—because he was willing to give up comfort for the cause of justice.

### ***Biblical Models of Selfless Leadership***

#### *1. David – 1 Samuel 17*

While others ran from Goliath, David ran toward him. His courage was his sacrifice.

#### **Reflection Activity:**

What “Goliath” (difficult challenge) are you avoiding that might be your door to destiny?

#### *2. Esther – Esther 4:16*

She risked her life to save her people. “If I perish, I perish,” became her anthem.

#### **Reflection Activity:**

What risks are you willing to take for a just cause?

#### *3. Timothy – Philippians 2:20-23*

Philippians 2:20-23 KJV

For I have no man likeminded, who will naturally care for your state. [21] For all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's. [22] But ye know the proof of him, that, as a son with the father, he hath served with me in the gospel. [23] Him therefore I hope to send presently, so soon as I shall see how it will go with me.

Paul said of him: “I have no one else like him... Timothy has proved himself.” He followed not for gain, but out of love and loyalty.

#### **Scripture Focus:**

1 Timothy 1:5 — *“The goal of this command is love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.”*

#### **Activity:**

Write down 3 reasons you are serving in your current role. Are they rooted in sacrifice or self-interest?

#### ***Life Lessons:***

- Sacrifice is the true currency of greatness.
- Comfort rarely leads to impact; sacrifice does.
- Your legacy will not be defined by what you owned but by what you gave.

Group Discussion Questions:

1. What are practical ways you can live sacrificially this week?
2. Who in your life has demonstrated selfless leadership? What can you learn from them?
3. How can you apply Timothy's example to your role in ministry, business, or community?

**Call to Action:**

Let us rise like Timothy—leaders not driven by gain, but by godly passion. May our generation not perish because we chose comfort over courage.

**Prayer:**

Lord, make me a leader who sacrifices. Deliver me from selfish ambition and help me to serve with a pure heart. Let my life be a legacy of love, sacrifice and purpose.

**Memory Verse:**

*"But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you."* — Matthew 6:33

Let this message not just inspire—but activate something deep in you.

**Lead sacrificially. Live intentionally. Leave a legacy.**

**LEADERSHIP TYPE: ONE EGYPT, TWO PHARAOHS**  
*The Same Land, Different Outcomes*

Leadership has always shaped the destiny of nations, families, organisations, and even churches. The biblical land of Egypt is one such case study—one land, two leaders, two very different results. These Pharaohs represent two leadership paradigms: one that builds and blesses; another that destroys and divides.

Let's explore the traits of these two Pharaohs and evaluate the kind of leaders we are becoming.

**PHARAOH IN JOSEPH'S DAY: THE NATION-BUILDER**

*Genesis 41; Genesis 47:13–26*

1. **He believed in divine help**
  - *"Can we find anyone like this man, one in whom is the spirit of God?"* — Genesis 41:38  
He recognised that God speaks and chooses people for His purposes.
2. **He knew his limitations**
  - He didn't pretend to have all the answers. He sought a man who could interpret his dreams.
3. **He accepted help and gave credit**
  - He honoured Joseph's gifting and elevated him without envy.
4. **He was secure and promoted others**
  - He placed Joseph second-in-command and stepped back to let him lead.
5. **He trusted others and delegated responsibility**
  - He never micromanaged. Trust is a currency of productive leadership.
6. **He was a listening leader**
  - When the people came to him in famine, he responded to their cry (Genesis 47:13-26).
7. **He prioritised citizens' welfare**
  - His decisions ensured not just survival but prosperity.

8. **He was visionary**
  - He embraced Joseph's long-term strategy and prepared the nation accordingly.
9. **He built a civilisation**
  - Egypt became a centre of commerce and global influence under his reign.
10. **He was kind to strangers**
  - He welcomed Jacob and his sons and gave them the best part of the land (Genesis 47:5-6).

## PHARAOH IN MOSES' DAY: THE OPPRESSOR

### *Exodus 1–14*

1. **He had no regard for God**
  - *"Who is the Lord, that I should obey his voice to let Israel go?"* — Exodus 5:2
2. **He was blind to his limitations**
  - He resisted God repeatedly, refusing to acknowledge divine authority.
3. **He rejected help**
  - Instead of learning from Moses, he challenged him with magicians and counterfeits.
4. **He was insecure and competitive**
  - Insecure leaders attack what they should honour.
5. **He lacked trust**
  - He viewed the Israelites' desire for worship as rebellion.
6. **He was deaf to the people's cry**
  - He intensified their burdens when they cried out.
7. **He devalued the lives of his subjects**
  - His decisions led to the loss of livestock, economy, and eventually, firstborns.
8. **He was short-sighted**
  - He followed the Israelites into the parted sea—a decision that defied reason.
9. **He led his nation into destruction**
  - Egypt was devastated under his rule.
10. **He lacked compassion**
  - Hardened to the weak and obsessed with control.

### ***What Type of Leader Are You?***

Are you the Pharaoh who builds or the Pharaoh who breaks?

Scripture teaches:

- *“The righteous man leads a blameless life; blessed are his children after him.”* — Proverbs 20:7
- *“By justice a king gives a country stability, but one who is greedy for bribes tears it down.”* — Proverbs 29:4

### **Reflection Activities for Groups or Classes**

1. **Leadership Self-Audit**

Create a two-column checklist with traits from both Pharaohs. Ask participants to assess which qualities they exhibit more often.

2. **Leadership Role Play**

Split into two groups. Let one group act as Joseph’s Pharaoh and the other as Moses’ Pharaoh. Each group discusses and presents the outcomes of their leadership styles.

3. **Vision**

Ask participants to write down one vision they have for their sphere of influence (family, ministry, business) and how they will build it like Joseph’s Pharaoh.

**Mapping**

4. **Accountability Partnering**

Pair participants to check in weekly on how they’re applying servant leadership and humility in real life.

5. **Scripture Memory Challenge**

Assign these verses to memorise:

- Proverbs 29:2
- Matthew 20:26–28
- Romans 12:8

### **Call to Action**

Leadership is influence, and your influence shapes destinies. The kind of Pharaoh you become will determine whether your Egypt becomes a land of flourishing or a land of groaning.

*“Choose this day whom you will serve...”* — Joshua 24:15

Be the Pharaoh who listens to God, honours people, builds for the future, and leads with wisdom and compassion.

**What kind of Egypt will your leadership create?**

## DON'T DRAG YOUR TROUBLE ALONG – LIVING BEYOND LIMITS

### **Overview:**

This course equips Christian leaders and believers with spiritual and practical tools to overcome past failures, setbacks, and disappointments. Drawing from biblical principles, students will learn to walk in purpose, regain momentum, and lead lives that glorify God.

### **Objectives:**

By the end of this course, participants will:

- Understand how past mistakes can hinder future growth.
- Learn biblical strategies for emotional and spiritual healing.
- Develop resilience and vision for purposeful leadership.
- Break free from stagnation and guilt.
- Lead others with compassion, wisdom, and authenticity.

### ***The Weight of Yesterday***

**Key Focus:** Identifying how past mistakes affect present progress.

### **Scriptures:**

- *Philippians 3:13-14* – “Forgetting what is behind... I press on toward the goal...”
- *Isaiah 43:18-19* – “Forget the former things... I am doing a new thing!”

### **Activity:**

- Reflective journaling: Write about one past event that still lingers and how it affects your decisions.

- Group discussion: “What is one thing from your past you need to release to lead better?”

### ***Mistakes Are Not the End***

**Key Focus:** Understanding God’s grace and redemption through failures.

**Scriptures:**

- *Romans 8:28* – “All things work together for good...”
- *Psalms 37:24* – “Though he fall, he shall not be utterly cast down...”

**Activity:**

- Case study: Share biblical examples (e.g., David’s sin and restoration, Peter’s denial and comeback).
- Personal exercise: Write a letter to your younger self about grace and growth.

### ***Moving On After the Shock***

**Key Focus:** Building a healthy mindset after setbacks like job loss, heartbreak, or rejection.

**Scriptures:**

- *Ecclesiastes 3:1* – “There is a time for everything...”
- *Psalms 147:3* – “He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds.”

**Activity:**

- Role play: Reenact “Job loss recovery” or “heartbreak healing” scenes and propose godly responses.
- Vision board: Create a new plan for your life with fresh goals and God’s promises.

### ***Breaking Addictive Cycles of Escape***

**Key Focus:** How unresolved pain can lead to vices and escapism.

**Scriptures:**

- *1 Corinthians 6:12* – “I will not be mastered by anything.”

- *Galatians 5:1* – “It is for freedom that Christ has set us free...”

**Activity:**

- Accountability map: Identify escape patterns (e.g., addiction, idle talk, busyness) and create a strategy with prayer partners to overcome.
- Write a “truth statement” to replace lies you’ve believed.

***Stop Covering – Start Conquering***

**Key Focus:** Moving from religious activity to meaningful action.

**Scriptures:**

- *James 2:17* – “Faith without works is dead.”
- *Matthew 5:16* – “Let your light shine before men...”

**Activity:**

- Workshop: Create a weekly action plan that balances prayer, planning, and productivity.
- Accountability check: Present your action plan to a mentor or group leader.

***Purpose Beyond the Pain***

**Key Focus:** Living intentionally and making your life count.

**Scriptures:**

- *Jeremiah 29:11* – “I know the plans I have for you...”
- *Romans 12:2* – “Be transformed by the renewing of your mind...”

**Activity:**

- Group project: Collaborate to launch a mini-outreach or initiative that addresses a social need.
- Teach a short 5-minute lesson to the group on “My New Beginning in Christ.”

**Conclusion:**

Don't linger at the crossroads of your past. Every leader has scars, but your scars can become signs of healing and strength. God is not done with you. Arise and lead!

**Final Scripture Meditation:**

*Isaiah 60:1* – “Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you.”

## THE DEAD SHOULD GIVE WAY – GO FORWARD

### **Overview:**

This course is designed to help leaders confront and overcome the past, embrace divine purpose, and rise to new levels of influence. Using biblical insight, personal reflection, and practical steps, you'll be equipped to move past the dead weights in your life and ministry and boldly advance in God's call.

### ***Understanding the Weight of the Past***

#### **Key Text:**

“And Amasa wallowed in blood in the midst of the highway... when he was removed... all the people went on...” – *2 Samuel 20:12-13*

#### **Key Insight:**

Just like the Israelites were halted because of Amasa's death, many leaders today are paralyzed by past trauma, failures, or disappointments. But you cannot lead from the past. Leadership requires forward motion.

#### **Activity:**

- **Reflection Journal:** Write down three “Amasas” in your life – things that are dead but still standing in your path.
- **Prayer Exercise:** Ask God for grace and strength to remove these obstacles.

### ***The Power of Perspective***

#### **Key Text:**

“Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith...” – *Hebrews 12:2-3*

**Key Insight:**

When your eyes are fixed on your dead past, you cannot move into the life ahead. But when your focus is Jesus—the finisher of your faith—you gain strength to go forward.

**Activity:**

- **Vision Board:** Create a simple board showing what your life looks like when you’ve moved forward. Include goals, scriptures, and people who inspire you.
- **Discussion:** Share your board with a small group or partner.

***Identifying Your Dead Amasa***

**Key Insight:**

You cannot defeat what you don’t define. Before Amasa could be removed, someone had to identify that his presence was halting progress.

**Scripture Meditation:**

“Consider Him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.” – *Hebrews 12:3*

**Activity:**

- **List your Limiting Factors:** What thoughts, relationships, habits or past events are holding you back? Be honest and detailed.
- **Speak Life:** Replace each one with a scripture that speaks life and hope.

***Practical Steps to Move Forward***

**Key Insight:**

Leadership is action. Faith must be followed by steps. God is not glorified when we stand still, afraid to rise again.

**Scripture Reflection:**

“Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing!”  
– *Isaiah 43:18-19*

**Activity:**

- **Action Plan:** Write down three steps you can take in the next 7 days to start your new chapter (e.g., start that project, reconcile, seek mentorship).
- **Accountability Partner:** Pair with someone who will check in on your progress weekly.

### ***Faith Over Fear***

#### **Testimony**

#### **Insight:**

The instructor shares a story of intense fear, almost losing sanity, but overcoming by confronting fear with the Word of God. This is proof that you, too, can walk past fear.

#### **Scripture Empowerment:**

“For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.” – *2 Timothy 1:7*

#### **Activity:**

- **Fear Challenge:** Identify one fear you’ve been avoiding and face it with God’s Word this week.
- **Scripture Declaration:** Memorise and declare scriptures that affirm boldness and victory.

### ***Final Charge: Go Forward!***

You cannot afford to linger anymore. The King’s business requires haste (1 Samuel 21:8). Let the dead give way. The time to move is now.

#### **Closing Scripture:**

“Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you.” – *Isaiah 60:1*

#### **Conclusion & Commitment**

**Write a Leadership Declaration:** "I declare that I will no longer allow dead things to define me. I will move forward in strength, led by the Spirit of God, to fulfil my divine purpose."

**COMING OUT OF HIDING TO THE LIMELIGHT**

Anchor Text: *Judges 6:11–17*

**Objective:**

This course is designed to awaken the leader in every believer who may be hiding under fear, insecurity, or limitations—just like Gideon. It helps participants to recognize God’s presence, embrace their identity, and rise to fulfil their divine assignment.

***When the Mighty Hides***

**Focus Scripture:** *Judges 6:11*

- Identify modern-day “winepress” situations—places of hiding and survival instead of bold living.
- Understand the psychological and spiritual effects of fear and limitation.

**Activity:**

- Journaling exercise: “Where am I hiding in life?”
- Group discussion: “How has fear shaped my decisions?”

***Divine Encounter – The Call to Destiny***

**Focus Scripture:** *Judges 6:12-14*

- Recognising divine interruptions as calls to leadership.
- God sees who you are, not where you are.

**Scripture Support:**

- *Jeremiah 1:5* – “Before I formed you... I ordained you...”
- *Isaiah 41:10* – “Fear not... I will help you.”

**Activity:**

- Write a “Dear Me” letter as a message from God, affirming who He says you are.
- Role-play the angel-Gideon encounter in groups.

### ***God Is With You – Emmanuel Consciousness***

**Focus Scripture:** *Judges 6:12, Matthew 1:23*

- Embracing God’s presence as your strength.
- Understanding Emmanuel as the confidence booster in leadership.

**Scripture Support:**

- *Psalms 27:1–3, Isaiah 7:14, Matthew 28:20*

**Activity:**

- Meditation and confession session on God’s presence.
- Create a "God-is-with-me" visual board with scriptures and affirmations.

### ***Breaking the Limits***

**Focus Scripture:** *Judges 6:15-16*

- Deal with identity crisis and self-doubt.
- Learn the law of internal substance—how you see yourself determines your output.

**Scripture Support:**

- *2 Timothy 1:7* – Power, love, and sound mind
- *Romans 12:2* – Be transformed by renewing your mind

**Activity:**

- Group brainstorming: What lies keep us small? Replace them with truth.
- Identity mapping: Who I was vs. Who I am in Christ

### ***Walking in Pre-Finished Victories***

**Focus Scripture:** *Judges 6:17, Ephesians 2:10*

- Every divine assignment is already supplied with victory.
- How to engage in spiritual battles from a place of victory.

**Scripture Support:**

- *2 Chronicles 20:15* – "The battle is not yours..."
- *Romans 8:37* – "More than conquerors..."

**Activity:**

- Case study of biblical leaders who fought finished battles.
- Personal declaration writing: “My Battle Is Won”

***Wrap-Up:***

- Reaffirm your identity and assignment.
- Step out with faith and courage.
- Encourage accountability groups for ongoing support.

***Activity:***

“From the Winepress to the Battlefield”

Participants will prepare a brief presentation of their journey from hiding to leadership and declare one bold step they will take in real life as a result of the course.

## 6

### THE MIGHT OF MAN

#### *Unlocking God's Power Within to Lead and Overcome*

##### **Overview:**

This course aims to awaken the greatness that God has already deposited in every believer. Through biblical insights, spiritual exercises, and practical applications, participants will rediscover their identity as mighty leaders, equipped to conquer limitations and fulfill divine purpose.

##### ***You Are Mighty Already***

**Anchor Scripture:** *"The Lord is with thee, thou mighty man of valour."* – Judges 6:12

##### Key Concepts:

- You are not waiting to become mighty; you were created mighty.
- Identity precedes manifestation—what God calls you is what you truly are.
- The breath of God in you is the DNA of greatness.

##### Activity:

- **Identity Mirror:** Write out 10 "I Am" statements based on scriptures (e.g., I am more than a conqueror – Romans 8:37). Speak them aloud daily.
- **Reflection Journal:** Reflect on moments when you underestimated your potential and how that changes today.

### ***From Glory to Glory***

**Scripture Focus:** *2 Corinthians 3:16–18*

Key Concepts:

- Turning to the Lord removes the veil of ignorance and fear.
- As you behold His glory, you are transformed into His likeness.
- The Spirit of God in you is the engine of liberty and growth.

Activity:

- **Beholding Exercise:** Spend 10 minutes daily meditating on a name or attribute of God (e.g., Jehovah Nissi, El Shaddai).
- **Group Discussion:** Share testimonies of personal transformation since you turned fully to God.

### ***The Bulldozer Within***

**Illustration:** A bulldozer doesn't need to become powerful—it already is. It only needs to be used.

Key Concepts:

- You were born with innate, God-given power.
- The only thing limiting you is the refusal to activate what's already in you.
- Your background or failures do not redefine your power.

Scriptures:

- *"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."* – *Philippians 4:13*
- *"Whatever is born of God overcomes the world."* – *1 John 5:4*

Activity:

- **Power Inventory:** List out your gifts, strengths, and areas of passion. Identify ways to channel them for God's kingdom.
- **Accountability Partner:** Pair with someone to hold each other accountable on developing and using one gift.

### ***Power for Purpose***

**Scripture Focus:** *Ephesians 3:20* – “...according to the power that works in us.”

Key Concepts:

- God equips you with might not for show, but for service.
- Your leadership is for solving problems, bringing peace, and building lives.
- Every obstacle is an opportunity to reveal God's power in you.

Activity:

- **Purpose Project:** Pick a community issue or ministry need. Design a small project using your God-given strengths to address it.
- **Faith Step:** Do something outside your comfort zone this week (preach, organise, lead, solve)—depending on God’s might.

### ***Final Charge: No Limits***

**Scripture Focus:** *Romans 8:31* – “If God be for us, who can be against us?”

- The enemy cannot stop you.
- Circumstances cannot hold you.
- Fear is not your master.
- You are God’s instrument of change.

Final Activity:

- **Declaration Prayer Session:** Speak boldly over your life and leadership.
- **Vision Commitment:** Write out and share a one-year leadership goal rooted in faith and courage.

### **Prayer**

*"Lord, thank you for your power within me. I choose to believe what you say about me—that I am mighty. I shake off limitations and rise in the strength of your Spirit to lead and conquer. In Jesus' Name. Amen."*

**CONNECTING THE LINES OF FAITH**

*Drawing Strength from God's Past Faithfulness*

**Objective**

To empower Christian leaders to overcome limitations and rise into their divine assignments by learning to connect their faith to God's past works in the lives of biblical heroes and people around them.

***God Chooses with Purpose***

Key Scripture:

*"And the LORD looked upon him, and said, Go in this thy might, and thou shalt save Israel from the hand of the Midianites: have not I sent thee?" – Judges 6:14*

Focus:

Understanding that God never makes mistakes in who He chooses. You are chosen for a reason—your calling is not an accident.

Activities:

- Reflective journaling: *"Why do I believe God chose me?"*
- Group discussion: Share stories of how God's choice of unlikely people (e.g. Moses, David, Paul) led to great deliverance.

### ***Recalling the Wonders of God***

Key Scripture:

*“Did not the LORD bring us up from Egypt?”* – Judges 6:13

Focus:

Just like Gideon, leaders must learn to remember what God has done before. His past faithfulness fuels present courage.

Activities:

- Create a “Faith Timeline” – write down key testimonies or breakthroughs in your life and those around you.
- Group prayer session thanking God for past miracles.

### ***Activating the Mantle of Faith***

Key Scripture:

*“Where is the LORD God of Elijah?”* – 2 Kings 2:14

Focus:

Elisha didn't just carry the mantle—he used it. Your spiritual inheritance is for action, not decoration.

Activities:

- Mantle Moment: Share a testimony where you imitated a spiritual principle or act from a mentor and it worked.
- Exercise: Identify one challenge you're facing and ask: “How would a faith-giant before me have handled this?”

### ***Go in This Thy Might***

Key Scripture:

*“Go in this thy might.”* – Judges 6:14

Focus:

You already have the strength and grace to break through. Your limitations are often mental and emotional, not spiritual.

Activities:

- Affirmation exercise: Write and recite your own “Go in this thy might” declaration.
- Role play: Face an imagined challenge, respond as Gideon or Elisha would.

### ***Connecting the Lines of Faith***

Key Message:

Faith is not vague—it’s rooted in divine patterns. Find the line and follow it.

Activities:

- Create a “Faith Map”: Identify 3 biblical heroes, 3 mentors, and 3 peers—what similar faith steps did they take?
- Prayer Assignment: Intercede over areas where your faith must rise.

### ***Final Charge***

*“Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever.”* – Hebrews 13:8

The God who parted the Red Sea, who brought fire from heaven, who raised the dead—is still your God.

Draw from His past to build your present and lead into the future.

## DEALING WITH THE LIES – UNLOCKING THE LEADER WITHIN

*"And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." – John 8:32*

### **Overview**

Many leaders struggle not because of external opposition but due to internal deception—lies they have come to believe about God, themselves, and their destiny. This course uses the life of Gideon to help Christian leaders identify and break free from limiting beliefs and establish their identity in the truth of God's Word.

### ***Breaking the Chains of History***

Key Focus: Understanding the weight of generational experiences and national crises on personal identity.

Scripture Anchor: *Judges 6:1-10*

Gideon grew up in a culture of defeat. His nation was overrun, his family impoverished, and the stories of God's might seemed like myths.

Activity: Personal History Mapping

Draw a timeline of your personal and family history. Highlight moments of fear, lack, or doubt. Identify any lies you've believed from those moments (e.g., "I'm not good enough," "God doesn't care about me").

Value-Centric Leadership.

Exposing the Lie of Idolatry

Key Focus: Recognising the futility of false solutions.

Scripture Anchor: *Exodus 20:3 – “Thou shalt have no other gods before me.”*

Gideon’s father served Baal, yet their household remained poor. This proves that no idol or worldly substitute can offer what only God provides.

Activity: Idol Detector

Write down anything you depend on more than God for security, identity, or provision (e.g., money, approval, titles). Pray for grace to surrender these idols.

### ***God’s Report vs. Your Report***

Key Focus: Replacing self-doubt with God’s identity for you.

Scripture Anchor: *Judges 6:12 – “The Lord is with thee, thou mighty man of valour.”*

Gideon saw himself as the least in his family, but God called him mighty. We must reject labels from the world and receive the identity God gives.

Activity: Identity Confession Cards

Create 5 cards with scriptures that declare your true identity in Christ. Read them aloud every morning (e.g., *2 Corinthians 5:17, Romans 8:37, 1 Peter 2:9*).

### ***The Power of the Right Words***

Key Focus: Aligning with empowering words that propel you forward.

Scripture Anchor: *Proverbs 18:21 – “Death and life are in the power of the tongue...”*

Gideon remained in defeat until the angel’s words of affirmation redirected his destiny. As Christian leaders, we must surround ourselves with life-giving words.

Activity: Word Audit

Monitor your words for 3 days. List phrases you say or think often. Highlight negative patterns and replace them with biblical truth.

***You Are the Answer***

Key Focus: God sends you to be the change, not to wait for it.

Scripture Anchor: *Judges 6:14 – “Go in this thy might...”*

Gideon thought he was waiting on God, but God was waiting on him. Leaders must take initiative and move forward in faith.

Activity: Bold Step Challenge

List one thing you’ve been afraid to do that aligns with your calling. Take one actionable step this week—make a call, send a proposal, or initiate a plan.

***Conclusion: Don’t Believe the Lie***

You cannot grow beyond the word you choose to believe. Lies keep you bound; truth sets you free. Like Gideon, when you rise above fear and step into God’s truth, the leader in you emerges to shape nations.

**Final Activation Scripture:**

*“Be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind...”* – Romans 12:2

## A NEW DAWN: BREAKING THROUGH THE LIMITS

### *Introduction*

Every generation needs a Gideon—someone who chooses to believe, obey, and rise above limitations to influence nations. In this course, we explore how Gideon broke free from personal, family, and national oppression, and how you too can walk boldly into your God-given destiny.

### *God Is With You – The Power of Divine Presence*

#### **Key Scripture:**

*“The Lord is with you, mighty man of valour.”* – Judges 6:12 (NKJV)

#### Lesson Summary

Gideon saw himself as weak and insignificant, but God saw a mighty warrior. God’s presence is not dependent on your past or present condition. He is with you, even in doubt, fear, or perceived insignificance.

#### Key Points

- God reaffirms His presence even in our weakest moments.
- Your past does not disqualify your purpose.
- The presence of God turns the ordinary into the extraordinary.

#### Activity

- **Self-Reflection Journal:** Write down moments where you felt unqualified or abandoned. Then, write down what God says about you in scriptures (e.g., Romans 8:37, 2 Timothy 1:7).
- **Group Discussion:** Share personal experiences of feeling limited and how God showed up for you.

### ***Confirming the Call – Faith in Uncertain Times***

#### **Key Scripture:**

*“If now I have found favor in Your sight, then show me a sign.”* – Judges 6:17 (NKJV)

#### Lesson Summary

Gideon asked for signs—and God gave them. When we are willing to obey, God assures us. His confirmation builds courage and strengthens our faith to move forward.

#### Key Points

- It is not weakness to ask for confirmation when walking in new faith.
- God is patient with our questions when our heart is positioned for obedience.
- Divine signs prepare us for bold action.

#### Activity

- **Faith List:** List areas in your life where you need God's assurance. Pray and trust God to speak.
- **Prayer Exercise:** Partner with a classmate and pray over each other's assignments and uncertainties.

### ***The Word That Breaks Limits***

#### **Key Scripture:**

*“He sent His word and healed them, and delivered them from their destructions.”* – Psalm 107:20 (NKJV)

#### Lesson Summary

The Word of God catapulted Gideon from hiding to national leadership. When received, the Word removes fear, emboldens purpose, and brings divine empowerment.

#### Key Points

- The Word transforms you from limitation to liberation.
- Your obedience to the Word is your first step to national relevance.
- True leaders are born from encounters with the Word.

### Activity

- **Scripture Meditation:** Meditate on Isaiah 60:1-3. Write how it applies to your current journey.
- **Act on the Word:** Do something this week you've been afraid to do, trusting in God's backing.

### ***The Courage to Confront Idolatry***

#### **Key Scripture:**

*"Tear down your father's altar to Baal."* – Judges 6:25 (NIV)

#### Lesson Summary

Gideon broke the altar of Baal, despite knowing the social and personal risks. He challenged the culture and idols of his father's house. True leadership begins with bold obedience.

#### Key Points

- Personal altars must be torn down before public battles can be won.
- God calls us to challenge cultural norms that oppose His will.
- One person's courage can set generations free.

### Activity

- **Personal Audit:** Identify "altars" (habits, beliefs, affiliations) in your life that must go.
- **Prayer Walk:** Walk through your home or neighbourhood declaring freedom from spiritual oppression.

### ***Boldness That Inspires Nations***

#### **Key Scripture:**

*"One man of you shall chase a thousand, for the Lord your God is He who fights for you."* – Joshua 23:10 (NKJV)

#### Lesson Summary

Gideon's faith moved an entire nation. His story reminds us that bold faith has ripple effects. When we rise, others are empowered to rise with us.

### Key Points

- Boldness in God is contagious.
- National transformation begins with personal alignment.
- Many await your obedience to find their freedom.

### Activity

- **Vision Board:** Create a board that shows how your obedience can affect your family, community, and nation.
- **Testimony Time:** Share a moment when your courage influenced someone else.

### ***Final Charge: The Limits Are Broken***

#### **Key Scripture:**

*“Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith...”* – Hebrews 12:2 (KJV)

#### Lesson Summary

When your eyes are on Jesus, limits fade away. Like Gideon, you are called to rise, lead, and liberate. You are the man or woman for this season.

### Activity

- **Declaration Challenge:** Speak aloud daily: “I break every limit by the power of God’s Word. I am called, equipped, and unstoppable.”
- **Assignment:** Write a short leadership manifesto starting with: “I am a Gideon in my generation because...”

### **Conclusion**

A new dawn is rising—not just for you, but for the people, nations, and futures connected to your obedience. Embrace the call. Tear down the limits. Rise like Gideon.

**You are the difference. You are the leader. You are the light.**

## 10

### THE WONDERS OF SOFTWARE – TRANSFORMING THE UNSEEN FOR KINGDOM LEADERSHIP

#### **Overview:**

This course explores how the unseen part of man—his spirit and soul—functions like software in a computer, determining outcomes in life, leadership, relationships, and destiny. Using biblical truths, participants will learn to reprogram their inner life with the Word of God to unlock purpose, excellence, and impact.

#### ***You Are More Than Flesh – Understanding the Inner Software***

#### Key Scripture:

“The spirit of a man is the lamp of the Lord, searching all the inner depths of his heart.” – *Proverbs 20:27*

#### Content:

- Comparison between computer hardware and software.
- Just as computers can look similar but run very different programs, humans can appear alike outwardly, but their inner programming differs drastically.
- Our spirits (software) determine what we can carry out in life.

#### Activity:

- **Self-Reflection Exercise:** Journal your current ‘software’ – what thoughts, beliefs, and habits are running your life?
- **Group Discussion:** What “programs” are commonly installed by society, and how do they affect leadership potential?

### ***The Power of the Word – Installing the Right Software***

Key Scripture:

“The words I have spoken to you—they are full of the Spirit and life.” – *John 6:63*  
“And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us...” – *John 1:14*

Content:

- Words are the principal means by which software (spirit essence) is installed or corrupted.
- God's Word is spirit and life—it installs divine capabilities in us.

Activity:

- **Memory Verse Challenge:** Memorise and meditate on John 6:63.
- **Installation Practice:** Each participant chooses a Scripture about purpose or prosperity and writes a daily declaration with it for the week.

### ***Spirit-Led Leaders – Replacing Viruses with Vision***

Key Scripture:

“Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind...” – *Romans 12:2*

Content:

- Malware (wrong thoughts, fear, bitterness) must be removed to run effectively.
- Leaders must constantly scan and update their spirit-man through God's Word.

Activity:

- **Detox Session:** List and renounce harmful “software” (e.g., fear, lust, pride).
- **Installation Session:** Replace them with Scripture-based affirmations.

### ***High-Functioning Software – Living a Life That Serves Nations***

Key Scripture:

“You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden.” – *Matthew 5:14*

Content:

- Some people's software is built for mere survival, while others are for significance and service.
- God's intention is for us to operate at the highest level of influence.

Activity:

- **Vision Board Creation:** Sketch what a "nation-serving" life looks like for you.
- **Prayer Activation:** Lay hands on one another and speak words of purpose, power, and prosperity.

***Rebooting for Leadership Excellence***

Key Scripture:

"Behold, I make all things new." – *Revelation 21:5*

Content:

- No matter your past, you can uninstall faulty belief systems and reboot into a new life of dominion.
- A transformed spirit will birth a transformed leader.

Activity:

- **Leadership Commitment Card:** Write a pledge to commit to spirit-led leadership.
- **Peer Accountability:** Pair up to check on each other's "software health" weekly.

***Final Charge: You Can, Because He Is!***

Key Scripture:

"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." – *Philippians 4:13*

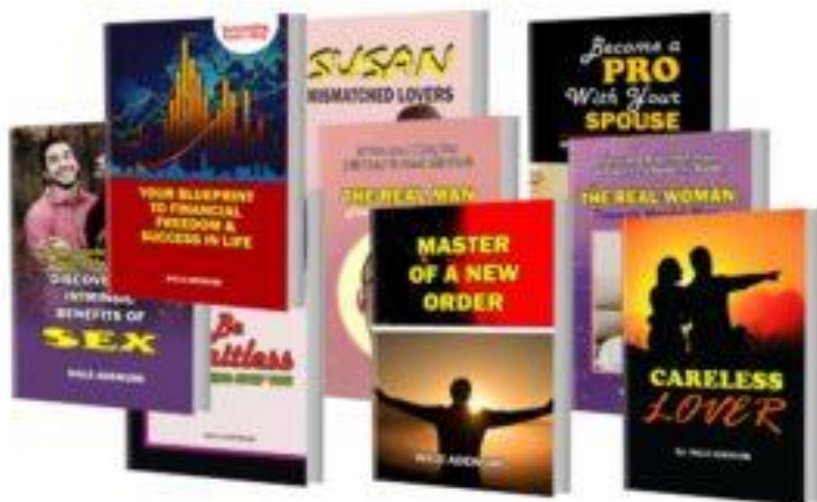

#### *Discovering the Life That's Truly Yours*

##### **Overview:**

This course is designed to help emerging Christian leaders discover the path to a life of fulfillment and rest through divine creativity rather than human competition. Participants will be challenged to shift from striving to creating, from comparison to purpose, and from pressure to peace.

##### **Objective:**

To raise leaders who live and lead from a place of creative identity in Christ—leading not by competition but by divine inspiration and innovation.

##### **Core Program & Activities:**

Understanding the Life That's Truly Yours

**Key Scripture:** *"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."* – Matthew 11:28

- **Topic Focus:** Exploring God's intention for a restful, fulfilled life.
- **Activity:** Reflective journal entry – *"Where in my life am I striving instead of resting?"*
- **Leadership Tip:** Restful leadership attracts solutions.

### ***The Trap of Competition***

#### **Key Stories:**

- Moses and the rod (Exodus 14)
- Elijah and the widow’s flour (1 Kings 17)
- Elisha and Elijah’s mantle (2 Kings 2)
- **Activity:** Scripture study groups – Identify creative responses to crisis in biblical stories.
- **Leadership Insight:** Great leaders birth solutions, not excuses.

From Pressure to Peace: Speaking to Your Soul

**Key Scripture:** *“Return to your rest, O my soul, for the Lord has been good to you.” – Psalm 116:7*

- **Topic Focus:** Rest is a spiritual force that fuels destiny.
- **Activity:** Write a prophetic declaration to your soul about rest and peace.
- **Leadership Insight:** A rested soul leads a thriving people.

***Warning Against Performance-Driven Leadership***

**Key Scripture:** *“What does it profit a man if he gains the whole world, but loses his soul?” – Mark 8:36*

- **Topic Focus:** Why true leadership outlives applause and competition.
- **Activity:** Personal vision board – not for achievements, but for peace, purpose, and impact.
- **Leadership Wisdom:** Don’t burn out for a crown that can’t crown your soul.

***Conclusion:***

This is your call to rise—not by competing—but by creating, resting, and leading with purpose. Let your leadership be defined not by how loud you are, but by how much life flows through you.

**Final Declaration:**

“I am not called to strive, but to create. I do not compete; I complete my assignment in peace. I speak to my soul: REST. I am a creative leader, made in the image of God.”

## 12

### LEADERSHIP AND CAPACITY – DISCOVERING AND FULFILLING YOUR GOD-GIVEN CALLING

#### **Objective:**

To equip believers with the understanding of leadership from a Kingdom perspective, help them discover their unique purpose, and stir them to activate and multiply their God-given capacity for influence, impact, and fulfillment.

#### ***Understanding Leadership from God's Perspective***

#### **Key Scripture:**

*"But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people..." – 1 Peter 2:9*

#### **Lesson Focus:**

- Leadership is not about titles or positions; it is about purpose and impact.
- Everyone is called to lead in some capacity—at home, in church, at work, in society.

#### **Activity:**

- Reflect and journal five ways you've influenced others in the past month. This helps you recognize areas of natural leadership.

#### ***Uniqueness and Divine Configuration***

#### **Scripture:**

*"But they measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise." – 2 Corinthians 10:12*

#### **Lesson Focus:**

- You are divinely wired and configured for a unique assignment.
- Your gifts, experiences, and personality are tools for your calling.

**Activity:**

- Create a “Purpose Profile” outlining your top 5 strengths, passions, and life experiences that have shaped you.
- Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to reveal what area these things are pointing to.

***Lessons from the Parable of the Talents***

**Scripture Reading:**

Matthew 25:14–30

**Core Takeaways:**

1. **Different Capacities:** Each servant was given different talents based on ability.
2. **No Room for Envy:** The master judged them by *what they did with what they were given*.
3. **Faithful Use Brings Multiplication:** Increase comes when you use your gift.
4. **Inaction is Costly:** The unfaithful servant lost even the little he had.

**Activity:**

- Identify your current talents or abilities (even if they seem “small”).
- Write out one action step you will take this week to grow each one.

***The Danger of Living Another Man’s Calling***

**Scripture:**

*“For the gifts and calling of God are without repentance.” – Romans 11:29*

**Lesson Focus:**

- Following another’s path instead of your divine calling leads to regret, emptiness, and stagnation.
- You are not a duplicate. Stop being an echo; be a voice.

**Story Illustration:**

An elderly man was called into ministry but chose to follow his friend’s business venture. After years of labour, he was cast aside—only then did he try to pursue his original call, late in life.

**Activity:**

- Reflect: Have you abandoned a divine instruction for a seemingly better opportunity? Write it down.

### GETTING THINGS DONE – FOCUS ON RELATIONSHIP

#### **Overview**

This course explores how to achieve harmony, peace, and productivity in Christian leadership influence and relationships—not by commands or complaints, but by godly example. You'll learn the spiritual power of living your values, leading in love, and influencing through Christ-like behaviour.

#### **Objectives**

By the end of this course, participants will:

1. Understand the power of example over instruction.
2. Learn how to lead within the family through servant-leadership.
3. Apply biblical principles to reduce quarrels and increase intimacy.
4. Identify personal areas to model the change they seek.
5. Develop actionable strategies for trust, transparency, and peace in the home and life

#### ***The Power of Example***

##### **Key Scripture:**

*John 13:14-15 (KJV)*

*"If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you."*

##### **Teaching Points:**

- Example is louder than instruction.
- Jesus led by doing what He expected of others.
- In marriage, your behaviour influences more than your words.

**Activity:**

- Write down 3 things you frequently complain about in your marriage, community and organisation.
- For each, write a positive action you can take to model the solution.
- Begin to practise one each week.

***Servant Leadership***

**Illustration:**

An elderly man disliked dirty dishes left overnight. Repeated complaints didn't change anything—until he started washing the dishes himself. Eventually, the family followed his example.

**Key Scripture:**

*1 Peter 3:1-2 (NIV)*

*"...they may be won over without words by the behavior of their wives, when they see the purity and reverence of your lives."*

**Teaching Points:**

- Servant leadership invites change without confrontation.
- Small acts of service build large bridges of influence.
- True leadership means modelling what you expect.

**Activity:**

- Choose one area of conflict or transformation you want in your marriage or community
- Develop a "servant-leader strategy" for that issue: What small action can you take daily that models love and responsibility?

***Creating New Standards through Example***

**Illustration:**

For instance, a sitting room stayed unarranged despite many complaints—until someone else rearranged it once. That moment redefined the standard.

**Key Insight:**

*"Your example sets the standard more powerfully than your voice ever could."*

**Key Scripture:**

*Matthew 7:12 (NIV)*

*“So in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you...”*

**Activity:**

- Evaluate 1-2 household or relational patterns that are unsatisfactory.
- Without confrontation, re-create them by acting out the change consistently for 7 days.

***Transparency and Trust***

**Teaching Points:**

- Don't just talk about financial transparency; practise it.
- Trust is not demanded—it's earned by example.
- Transparency encourages mutual openness and long-term harmony.

**Key Scripture:**

*Proverbs 10:9 (NIV)*

*“Whoever walks in integrity walks securely, but whoever takes crooked paths will be found out.”*

**Activity:**

- Begin tracking your financial activities openly with your spouse.
- Encourage your spouse to do the same without pressure—lead by showing how trust feels.

***Final Challenge: Live the Life***

**Reflection Questions:**

1. What areas in your marriage or leadership roles require more action and less talking?
2. Where have you been a commander instead of a model?
3. What is God asking you to change by living the change?

**Assignment:**

- Create a “Model Map” – list the top 5 values you want your marriage, business or world to reflect and 1 behaviour you will personally practise for each.

**LIFE OF MEANING: LIVING BEYOND VANITY**

***Objective:***

To equip believers with a deep understanding of what truly gives meaning to life, aligning their pursuits with God's purpose rather than vanity. Participants will learn to prioritise spiritual values over temporal pleasures and materialism, building a life that counts for eternity.

***1. The Pursuit of Meaning***

**Opening Scripture:**

*Ecclesiastes 1:2* – "Vanity of vanities, saith the Preacher, vanity of vanities; all is vanity."

***Key Teaching Points:***

- 90% of human pursuits are vanity.
- True meaning is only found in a life lived for God.

***Scriptural Anchor:***

*Ecclesiastes 2:11* – All was vanity and vexation of spirit.

***Activity:***

- **Reflective Exercise:** List five things you're currently pursuing. Rate them on eternal value (1–10). Discuss in small groups.

***2. Food – Mastering Appetite***

**Scripture:**

*1 Corinthians 6:13* – "Meats for the belly, and the belly for meats: but God shall destroy both it and them."

*Teaching Points:*

- Overindulgence in food makes one a slave to the flesh.
- Biblical figures like Moses and Jesus mastered food, resulting in spiritual power.

*Illustrations:*

- **Esau** lost his birthright.
- **Israel** was plagued in the wilderness.
- **Jesus** resisted Satan and gained dominion.

*Activity:*

- **Fasting Challenge:** Pick one meal to skip each day for 3 days and spend that time in prayer.

### **3: Sex – Guarding the Temple**

- **Modern media** as a tool for sexual pollution.

*Activity:*

- **Scripture Memorisation:** 1 Thessalonians 4:3–5 – God's will is sanctification and abstaining from sexual immorality.
- **Self-Reflection Journal:** What boundaries do I need to build to stay pure?

#### **4: Money – Beyond the Love of Wealth**

##### **Scripture:**

*1 Timothy 6:10* – “The love of money is the root of all evil...”

##### *Key Points:*

- Money is a tool, not a goal.
- Pursuit of wealth without purpose becomes idolatry.
- God is our source, not riches.

##### *Illustrations:*

- Politicians who worship money.
- Riches without peace and joy.
- The “Mammon” spirit – Matthew 6:24.

##### *Activity:*

- **Budgeting with Purpose:** Identify where your money goes. Allocate at least 10% to tithe and generosity this week.
- **Discussion Prompt:** “Can money steal your faith? Share real-life examples.”

#### **5: Success – Redefining Achievement**

##### **Scripture:**

*Proverbs 14:12* – “There is a way that seems right to a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death.”

##### *Key Points:*

- Earthly success is temporary.
- Godly success is tied to purpose.
- You can't take achievements to eternity.

##### *Illustrations:*

- Celebrities lose relevance after death.
- Professors can't take academic titles to heaven.
- Eternal success is about souls and purpose.

*Activity:*

- **Vision Board Workshop:** Create a purpose-driven life vision board.
- **Partner Discussion:** “What does success look like in heaven’s eyes?”

**6: What Is Life? Finding the True Meaning**

**Scripture:**

*John 10:10* – “I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.”

*Key Points:*

- Life is knowing and walking with God.
- Meaning is found in fulfilling your divine purpose.
- Eternal joy is a by-product of living intentionally for God.

*Activity:*

- **Purpose Discovery Exercise:** Answer three questions:
  1. What am I passionate about?
  2. What problem am I equipped to solve?
  3. What glorifies God through me?
- **Closing Commitment:** Write a letter to God committing to live a life of meaning. Share in small groups.

Course Conclusion:

The life that matters is the life lived for God. Food, sex, money, and success are not bad—but they must serve the higher purpose of glorifying God.

**Closing Scripture:**

*Colossians 3:2–3* – “Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth. For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God.”

**Prayer:**

Lord, help me live a life of meaning and not vanity. May my pursuits reflect Your will. Amen.

## 16

### **LISTENING: YOUR PATHWAY TO REIGNING IN LIFE (PART 1)**

#### **Overview**

This course is designed to help aspiring and growing Christian leaders unlock the power of listening as a divine tool for reigning in life. Through practical illustrations, biblical insights, and life-changing activities, students will discover how listening determines destiny, shapes relationships, and leads to relevance, respect, and lasting impact.

#### ***The Tragedy of Not Listening***

Lesson Objective:

Understand the consequences of poor listening habits and how pride can hinder divine direction.

Scriptural Focus:

- Proverbs 1:5 – “A wise man will hear, and will increase learning...”
- James 1:19 – “...Let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath.”

Illustration:

When I was younger, I trusted my strength and intelligence so much that I rarely listened to others. This stubbornness led me into many painful dead ends. I was unintentionally heading into failure—blindly.

Key Points:

- Intelligence without the humility to listen leads to foolishness.
- Professors can beg, and servants can reign—because the difference often lies in listening.
- A fool despises wisdom and instruction (Proverbs 1:7).

Activity:

- Reflect on one area of failure in your life. Write down if it was due to ignoring advice or counsel.
- Share with your group what you learned from that experience.

***The Marks of a Non-Listening Leader***

Recognise the symptoms of a hardened heart and closed ears.

Key Scriptures:

- Proverbs 12:15 – “The way of a fool is right in his own eyes: but he that hearkeneth unto counsel is wise.”
- Ecclesiastes 4:13 – “Better a poor but wise youth than an old but foolish king who no longer knows how to heed a warning.”

Key Points:

- Arrogance: Thinking you always know best.
- Ignoring counsel: A highway to repeated failure.
- Listening isn't weakness—it's leadership strength.

Activity:

- Group discussion: Share one example of a leader who failed because they didn't listen—and the outcome.
- Personal inventory: Rate your listening habits (1–10). How can you improve?

***Divine Counsel—Your Path to Victory***

Lesson Objective:

Learn how godly counsel brings safety, establishment, and triumph.

Key Scriptures:

- Proverbs 24:6 – “For by wise counsel thou shalt make thy war: and in multitude of counsellors there is safety.”

***The Cost of Not Listening***

- Proverbs 19:20 – “Hear counsel, and receive instruction, that thou mayest be wise in thy latter end.”

What You Stand to Lose:

- **Money:** Financial recklessness due to pride and pressure.
- **Relevance:** Outdated knowledge leads to irrelevance.
- **Respect:** Failure leads to ridicule.
- **Relationships:** Broken homes and friendships often trace back to unheeded feelings or counsel.
- **Health:** Sickness ignored becomes crisis.
- **Followers:** Leaders who ignore feedback lose influence.

Activity:

- Case study analysis: Review King Rehoboam (1 Kings 12). What did he lose by ignoring the elders' counsel?
- Journal Prompt: In which of these areas have I lost because I didn't listen?

***Building a Listening Culture in Leadership***

Learn how to cultivate a habit of deep, spiritual listening.

**CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP COURSE: LISTENING – YOUR PATHWAY TO REIGNING IN LIFE (PART 3)**

**Overview**

In this course, we dive into the transformative power of *listening to God* as a vital leadership skill and a pathway to reigning in life. You will learn how to silence the noise, hear the voice of God clearly, and act with precision in every season of life.

**Why Listening to God is Non-Negotiable**

1. Only God Knows Who You Really Are

*“And he said unto him, What is thy name? And he said, Jacob. And he said, Thy name shall be called no more Jacob, but Israel...”*

— Genesis 32:27–28 KJV

Jacob lived under a false identity until he heard from God. Many leaders today respond to old labels—failure, imposter, sinner—until they encounter God’s voice.

**Illustration:**

You may think you're insignificant, but God sees a prince or a queen in you. Like Jacob, your transformation begins when you hear Him speak your true name.

**Activity:**

- Write a list of your current needs. Pray and ask God for guidance on where to “cast your net.”
- Track any ideas or impressions you receive during the week. Obey quickly.

### ***Only God Can End Crisis in Your Life***

*“Call unto me, and I will answer thee, and shew thee great and mighty things, which thou knowest not.”*  
— Jeremiah 33:3 KJV

Following your own logic during crisis leads to deeper trouble. God's ways often contradict human reasoning.

#### **Real-Life Testimonies (from the author):**

- A financial scare during COVID turned into supernatural supply after listening and intense prayer.
- A family health crisis was subdued through strategic prayer and prophetic direction.

#### **Activity:**

- Journal a recent crisis and how you handled it. Ask: "Did I consult God first?"
- Partner with a prayer buddy. Commit to pray over every major decision this week.

### ***Listening is for Daily Decision-Making***

*“Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is.”*  
— Ephesians 5:17 KJV

Small, repeated mistakes can derail destinies. Wisdom comes from intentional listening.

#### **Activity:**

- At the start of each day, take 10 minutes for “Listening Prayer.” Ask: “What is Your will for today, Lord?”
- Record your impressions. Follow through on the smallest nudges.

### ***Channels for Hearing God***

Listening doesn’t always come through thunder and lightning. God speaks through:

1. **Prayer** – Not just speaking, but waiting on God.
2. **Scripture & Devotional Study** – The Word is God’s voice in written form.
3. **Godly Counsel** – Leaders need mentors and spiritual fathers.
4. **Wise Companionship** – Walk with the wise and grow wise (Proverbs 13:20).

#### **Activity:**

- Create a “Listening Journal.” Dedicate sections to each of these four channels.
- Weekly, review patterns in what God is showing you.

### ***Anchor Scripture***

*“His mother saith unto the servants, Whatsoever he saith unto you, do it.”*  
— John 2:5 KJV

Mary's secret to Jesus' first miracle was this: **Listen. Then act.** That's the recipe for divine manifestation.

### ***Leadership Takeaway***

Listening is the hallmark of spiritual leaders who reign. David, Jesus, Moses, Esther—all moved at God's instruction.

### *Listening—The Foundation of Grace in Relationships*

Abigail’s intervention prevented David from bloodshed. Her wisdom, and David’s ability to listen, altered the course of history.

- *Prayer Exercise:* Ask God for a heart that listens in the heat of pressure.

***The Power of Discernment in Hearing Right Voices***

**Objective:**

To develop the skill of discerning who to listen to and who to avoid as a leader called to reign in life, based on biblical truth, personal discipline, and practical wisdom.

***Outline***

*Introduction – The Voices that Shape a Leader*

- **Key Scripture:** Proverbs 13:20 – “He that walketh with wise men shall be wise: but a companion of fools shall be destroyed.”
- **Activity:** Reflect on 3 key decisions you’ve made. Who influenced them? Were those voices wise or destructive?

***Voices to Avoid***

*1. Naysayers and Those Who Look Down on You*

- **Case Study:** Nehemiah and his response to Sanballat and Tobiah (Nehemiah 4:1–6)
- **Lesson:** Focus on your God-given goals.
- **Activity:** Write down your current distractions. Are they coming from discouraging voices? What should you do about them?

*2. Gossips and Backbiters*

- **Insight:** Gossip pulls you backwards; focus pulls you forward.
- **Scripture:** Proverbs 26:20 – “Where there is no wood, the fire goes out; and where there is no talebearer, strife ceases.”

- **Activity:** Fast from unproductive conversations for a week. Journal the impact.

### *3. Enemies and Fault-Finders*

- **Scripture:** Luke 6:22–23 – Rejoice when men exclude and insult you for the sake of the Son of Man.
- **Key Point:** You cannot please everyone—don't try.

### *4. Rivals and Competitive Peers*

- **Example:** Resist the urge to compare; choose uniqueness over rivalry.
- **Scripture:** Galatians 6:4 – “Let every man prove his own work...”
- **Activity:** Write 5 things that make your calling unique.

### *5. Time-Wasters and Petty Talkers*

- **Scripture:** Ephesians 5:16 – “Redeeming the time, because the days are evil.”
- **Lesson:** Avoid idle chatter. Guard your environment.
- **Activity:** Track your conversations for a day. How many hours were value-adding?

## ***Voices Worth Listening To***

### *1. Those Who Add Value*

- **Example:** Amnon's downfall due to Jonadab (2 Samuel 13)
- **Lesson:** Wrong counsel brings destruction.
- **Activity:** List the 3 people whose words have helped you grow. Reach out and thank them.

### *2. Those Who Made You*

- **Example:** Saul lost his throne by ignoring Samuel (1 Samuel 13)
- **Wisdom:** Never despise those God used to lift you.
- **Activity:** Identify a mentor you've ignored and reconnect in humility.

### *3. Those Who Know Your Beginning*

- **Insight:** Such people speak truth without flattery.
- **Activity:** Interview a family member or long-time mentor. Ask, “What would you advise me to change or improve?”

*4. Those Who Know More Than You*

- **Scripture:** Proverbs 1:5 – “A wise man will hear and increase learning...”
- **Lesson:** Great leaders are humble listeners.
- **Activity:** Attend a session or seminar led by someone ahead of you. Take notes.

*5. Those Who Can Connect You*

- **Example:** David and the Egyptian slave (1 Samuel 30:11–15)
- **Wisdom:** Helpers are often disguised. Stay humble.
- **Activity:** Pray and ask God to open your eyes to hidden connectors.

*6. Those in Authority*

- **Scripture:** Romans 13:1–4 – Authority is God-ordained.
- **Lesson:** Respect God’s channels or miss His favour.
- **Activity:** List all authority figures in your life and pray for each of them.

*7. Those Who Love You*

- **Example:** Eve should have trusted God's love over Satan’s flattery.
- **Scripture:** 1 Corinthians 13 – Love seeks the best.
- **Activity:** Have a truth-telling session with someone who genuinely loves you.

*8. Those Anointed for You*

- **Scripture:** 2 Chronicles 20:20 – “Believe in the Lord your God... believe His prophets, so shall ye prosper.”
- **Caveat:** Discern true anointing by fruit (Matthew 7:16).
- **Activity:** Write down how prophetic voices have shaped your life, for better or worse.

***Practical Wisdom – When to Talk, When to Listen***

- **Proverbs 17:28** – “Even a fool is counted wise when he holds his peace...”
- **Activity:** For one full day, talk only when necessary. Reflect on how your perception changed.

**Conclusion:**

Your greatness is tied to your ability to *hear right*. Voices shape choices. Choices shape destiny. Leadership begins with listening—wise, humble, and discerning listening.

**Final Reflection Assignment:**

Write a personal action plan:

**“Voices I Will Stop Listening To” and “Voices I Will Honour More.”**

Include how you’ll practically make this shift in the next 30 days.

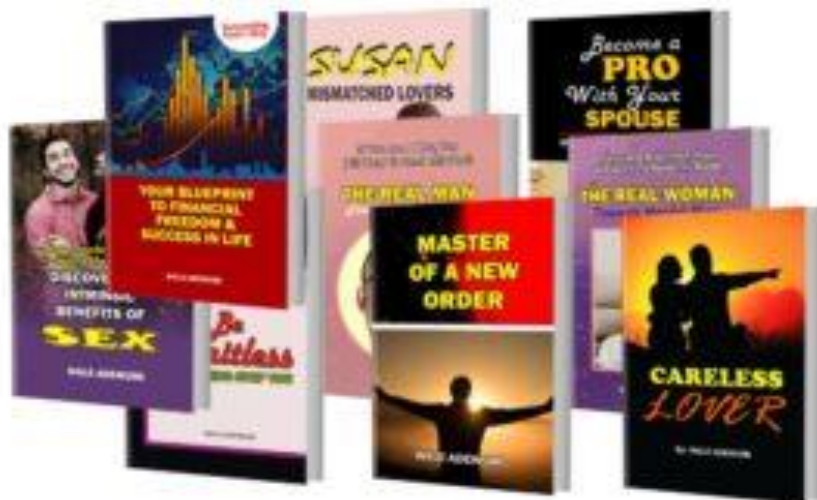

**ON POINT LEADERSHIP**

***Precision in Purpose, Obedience to Divine Instruction, and Christ-Centred Impact***

**Theme Scripture:**

*"Your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying, 'This is the way, walk in it,' whenever you turn to the right hand or whenever you turn to the left." — Isaiah 30:21 (NKJV)*

***The Call to Precision***

Key Teaching:

Success is rooted in the clarity of vision and divine instruction. God desires leaders who are *on point*—accurate, intentional, and obedient.

**Scripture Reference:**

- *Ecclesiastes 10:10* – "If the axe is dull and its edge unsharpened, more strength is needed, but skill will bring success."

### HARMONY WITH NATURE

#### *Aligning the Spiritual and Natural for Effective Christian Leadership*

##### Summary

This course helps Christian leaders understand the importance of harmonising spiritual principles with natural laws. It debunks the myth that spiritual living excludes practical wisdom and explores how Scripture teaches us to observe nature, apply strategy, and honour God's natural design in work, health, and purpose.

##### ***God's Strategy in Creation***

**Key Topic:** Strategy is not carnal; it's divine.

##### **Main Scripture:**

- *Proverbs 6:6-8* – “Go to the ant, you sluggard! Consider her ways and be wise...”

- Early missionaries came with skills (e.g., medicine, teaching).

**Activity:**

Interview an older minister who worked while building ministry. Summarise key insights and lessons.

***Investment: Heaven's Wisdom for Earthly Wealth***

**Key Topic:** Prosperity teaching must include investment principles.

**Main Scriptures:**

- *Matthew 25:14-30* – The parable of the talents.
- *Proverbs 21:20* – “The wise store up choice food and olive oil...”

**Key Lessons:**

- Investment is biblical and essential.
- Prosperity without practical financial teaching is empty.
- Christians must create wealth, not just sow seed.

**Activity:**

**Key Lessons:**

- Your calling may be outside the church walls.
- No anointing is greater—only assignments differ.
- Influence in the marketplace brings glory to God.

**Activity:**

Write a calling statement. Where are you anointed to serve – pulpit, politics, education, business, or elsewhere?

***Discovering Your Place – The Parable of the Trees***

**Key Topic:** Don’t abandon your strength for unfamiliar roles.

**Main Scriptures:**

- *Judges 9:7-13* – Each tree recognised its unique value.

**Key Lessons:**

- Don't leave your "fatness" or "sweetness" for ill-fitting roles.
- Every believer must find and stay in their God-ordained space.
- Impact is not pulpit-dependent.

**Activity:**

List your top 3 strengths. Where can these bear fruit most? Reflect and write a 1-page "assignment clarity" journal.

***Conclusion: Nature as God's Classroom***

Nature is not an enemy to the spirit—it is its ally. Creation reflects God's glory (*Psalm 19:1*). Effective Christian leadership harmonises both. As leaders, let's not fight nature in the name of spirituality. Let's live fully, wisely, and fruitfully—for God's glory.

## HARMONY WITH NATURE – PART 2

### *Understanding Divine Order through Nature*

#### ***Objective:***

To equip Christian leaders with a deeper understanding of how nature, under God's control, acts as a guide, teacher, and indicator of God's purpose. This course empowers believers to discern divine direction, avoid pitfalls, and harmonize spiritual growth with natural order.

#### ***Nature – Man's God-Given House***

*"The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it..." — Psalm 24:1*

- **Teaching Point:** Nature is not a random occurrence; it is intentionally created by God as a space where man can thrive. Just as a house provides comfort and protection, so does nature.
- **Illustration:** Destroying nature is like setting fire to your own bed and expecting to sleep well.
- **Scripture Study:** Genesis 1:28–30, Romans 1:20
- **Activity:** Reflect on a recent personal experience where natural consequences revealed a deeper truth. Journal it and share in small groups.

### ***Nature as a Spiritual Indicator***

*"It is hard for you to kick against the goads."* — Acts 26:14

- **Teaching Point:** Jesus told Paul on the way to Damascus that resistance against divine principles leads to pain. Nature operates within divine laws; breaking them brings consequences.
- **Illustration:** When Paul was blinded, nature halted him. When he obeyed, his sight and direction were restored.
- **Scripture Study:** 1 Corinthians 11:14, Job 12:7–10
- **Activity:** Identify two natural laws (e.g., rest, sowing & reaping) and how their violation has impacted someone you know or yourself.

### ***God Speaks Through Nature***

*"Even nature teaches us..."* — 1 Corinthians 11:14

- **Teaching Point:** Nature is one of God's most consistent methods of communication. Jesus consistently used natural parables. Discerning believers will always find divine instruction in natural occurrences.
- **Illustration:** Balaam's donkey resisted movement because of an angel—yet the prophet missed the sign until it almost cost his life.
- **Scripture Study:** Numbers 22:21–34, Matthew 6:26–30
- **Activity:** Study one of Jesus' parables that uses nature (e.g., sower and seed) and summarise its leadership implication.

### ***Lessons from Paul and Balaam – A Tale of Two Paths***

- **Teaching Point:** Paul aligned with divine direction after nature stopped him. Balaam ignored nature's protest and paid with his life.

- **Scripture Study:** 2 Peter 2:15, Jude 1:11, Numbers 22
- **Activity:** Create a comparison chart between Paul's and Balaam's experience—decisions, signs, outcomes.

### ***Interpreting Natural Signs in Life Decisions***

*"Be not like the horse or the mule, which have no understanding."* — Psalm 32:9

- **Teaching Point:** God places signs in our environments—jobs, relationships, health, even disruptions—to redirect or instruct us. Ignoring them may lead to destruction.
- **Illustration:** People experience challenges when relocating, taking up new jobs, or making friends—not necessarily due to sin, but as a sign.
- **Activity:** Group discussion – List 5 life decisions and the natural indicators that accompanied them. What were the outcomes?

### ***Practical Lessons from Nature***

- **1. Borrowing leads to servitude (Proverbs 22:7)**
- **2. Sowing precedes harvest (Genesis 8:22)**
- **3. Health is tied to discipline in eating (1 Corinthians 10:31)**
- **4. Thoughts influence health (Proverbs 17:22)**
- **5. Success in studies requires preparation (Proverbs 4:7)**

- Write down three areas where you feel God is calling you to greater obedience.

### ***Discernment – Knowing What to Do***

#### **Key Scripture:**

*"If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God..." – James 1:5*

Leaders often miss divine opportunities because they don't discern God's timing or strategy. Solomon asked for wisdom. David sought divine strategy.

#### **Prayer Focus:**

- Lord, teach me what to do and empower me to do it.

#### **Activity:**

- Ask the Holy Spirit daily: "What would you have me do today?"
- Keep a "God's Instruction" journal for divine nudges.

### ***Spiritual Alertness – Staying on Fire***

#### **Key Scripture:**

*"The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." – Matthew 26:41*

Lukewarmness dulls spiritual effectiveness. The early Church thrived because they remained fervent in spirit and prayer.

**Prayer Focus:**

- Lord, wake up my spirit. Let the fire of the Holy Spirit descend on me.

**Activity:**

- Morning prayer walk: Speak in tongues for 15 minutes asking for fresh fire.
- Personal revival plan: Write what spiritual habits to rekindle.

***Dealing with Distractions***

**Key Scripture:**

*"Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith..." – Hebrews 12:2*

Distractions derail destinies. Prayer clears distractions and helps you remain focused on God's assignment.

**Prayer Focus:**

- Lord, deaden every distraction from my path.

**Activity:**

- List your top 5 distractions and write strategies to overcome them.
- Fast from one of them this week as a commitment to realignment.

***Following Divine Leading***

**Key Scripture:**

*"Your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying, 'This is the way, walk in it.'" – Isaiah 30:21*

Every world changer must learn to follow divine nudging. It's the compass for destiny navigation.

**Prayer Focus:**

- Lord, help me follow your leading. Revive my inner man.

**Activity:**

- Practice daily stillness for 10 minutes to hear God's direction.
- Share in class: A time you followed God's prompting and saw a breakthrough.

***Overcoming Opposition***

**Key Scripture:**

*"The Lord rebuke you, Satan!" – Zechariah 3:2*

Whether human or demonic, opposition will rise. Only spiritual authority can deal with such enemies.

**Prayer Focus:**

- Lord, uproot every power working against my destiny.

**Activity:**

- Anoint yourself and pray over your dreams and plans.
- In groups, intercede for each other's purpose and protection.

***Provision for Vision***

**Key Scripture:**

*"But my God shall supply all your need..." – Philippians 4:19*

God funds what He calls for. No vision should die due to lack. Prayer releases divine supply.

**Prayer Focus:**

- Lord, supply everything needed to advance the course of my life.

**Activity:**

- Write a "Faith Budget" for your assignment or dream.
- Daily declare: "All my needs are met in Christ."

***Final Activation: Supernatural Power at Work***

**Key Scripture:**

*"Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly..." – Ephesians 3:20*

Wrap the course with a prophetic prayer session. Impartation for supernatural capacity as a world changer.

**Final Activity:**

- Write a personal prayer manifesto for your leadership journey.
- Lay hands on your head and speak every promise of God over your life.

***Conclusion:***

A prayerless leader is a powerless leader. If you want to be a world changer, let prayer be your secret weapon, your first response, and your final authority.

**Assignment:**

Prepare a 7-day personal prayer plan and implement it with fasting, journaling, and word study. Share testimonies at the next group session.

## PRAYER: A VITAL TOOL OF A WORLD CHANGER – PART 2

### *Building Inner Strength for Global Impact through Prayer and the Word*

#### ***Introduction***

Last week, we explored the power of prayer as a core tool for world changers. Today, we go further.

The truth remains: **nothing changes until prayer goes ahead of us.**

Even our Lord Jesus Christ, the ultimate World Changer, didn't step into His assignment without first laying the foundation in prayer (Luke 3:21-22; Luke 4:1-14).

#### ***Section 1: Prayer Must Precede Purpose***

##### **Key Insight:**

If you desire to shift your world, prayer must go before you. The environment is hostile to destiny and dreamers. If you don't cover your assignment in prayer, **forces stronger than ambition** will attempt to bury your potential.

##### **Illustration:**

Jesus prayed *fervently* before choosing His disciples (Luke 6:12-13), and before going to the cross (Matthew 26:36-46). He didn't confront major tasks without prayer.

##### **Activity:**

Spend 15 minutes daily this week praying over your calling, dreams, and nation. Keep a prayer journal of impressions, scriptures, and insights received.

## ***Section 2: Pray for a Spirit that Loves the Word***

### **Scripture Reference:**

*"Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly..."* – Colossians 3:16

*"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."* – Psalm 119:105

### **Insight:**

Without a heart drawn to the Word, you'll not discern God's direction or promises.

**Depth in the Word = Height in Exploits** (Daniel 11:32b – *"...but the people that do know their God shall be strong, and do exploits."*)

### **Prayer Point:**

Lord, give me a strong spirit that desires and devours Your Word.

### **Activity:**

- Memorise one scripture daily related to your current challenge or assignment.
- Meditate and write how it applies to your world-changing journey.

## ***Section 3: Pray for a Strong Spirit of Prayer***

### **Scripture Reference:**

*"The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much."* – James 5:16b KJV

*"Building yourselves up on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Spirit."* – Jude 1:20

### **Insight:**

A strong prayer life requires a **strong spirit**. Fervency is not about shouting—it's about **depth, focus, and fire**.

### **Illustration:**

Elijah prayed with inner fire and shifted the climate of a nation (1 Kings 18:41-45).

### **Prayer Point:**

Lord, ignite a fervent prayer fire within me. Make me a man/woman of unquenchable prayer.

### **Activity:**

- Commit to 30 minutes of personal, undistracted prayer daily.
- Include praying in the Spirit (if you do) or heartfelt groanings from the soul.

#### **Section 4: Pray for Boldness and Capacity**

##### **Scripture Reference:**

*"Be strong and very courageous..." – Joshua 1:7*

*"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." – Philippians 4:13*

##### **Insight:**

Without boldness, even a dream from God can die in fear. Boldness and capacity to act are divine gifts that sustain world changers.

##### **Prayer Point:**

Lord, I receive boldness to act and capacity to deliver Your assignment in my life.

##### **Activity:**

- List the top 3 things fear has stopped you from doing.
- Now, pray over them daily with boldness and start taking one bold action per week.

#### **Final Charge: Birth Something New**

This is **not just another teaching**—it is your activation moment.

Speak in tongues if you do; if not, groan deeply in prayer. Let **heaven meet earth** through your voice like Elijah.

##### **Scripture Reference:**

*"Before she travailed, she brought forth..." – Isaiah 66:7-9*

*"As soon as Zion travailed, she brought forth her children."*

Your world must not remain the same. The power to birth transformation is in your prayers.

##### **Closing Declaration:**

Lord, I am Your vessel. I receive fire in my bones, strength in my spirit, and power in my prayers. I declare: I am a world changer, raised by the Word and equipped through prayer!

**YOU ARE THE ROCK**

***Discovering Your Identity, Purpose, and Supernatural Self in Christ***

**Overview**

This course is designed to help you discover your God-given identity, connect with your purpose, and walk in the supernatural power that comes with knowing who you are in Christ. Through the lens of Peter’s transformation, we will explore how divine encounters shape ordinary lives into extraordinary vessels.

***Introduction – Discovering the Rock Within***

**Core Truth:**

*When you find Jesus, and when you find your purpose, you become the rock—strong, dependable, and unshakable.*

**Illustration:**

I once watched a wrestling match featuring a fighter called *The Rock*. He was beaten and almost defeated. Just when the crowd thought it was over, he rose with power and won the match. You were made to rise—no matter what life throws at you.

**Scripture Focus:**

“On this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it.”  
– *Matthew 16:18 (NIV)*

**Activity:**

Reflect and write:

- What moments in life made you feel defeated?
- How did you rise—or how can you rise through Christ?

### ***What's In a Name? – From Simon to Peter***

#### **Core Truth:**

The world may call you one thing, but heaven knows your true name.

#### **Peter's Journey:**

Peter was born Simon—meaning "reed", fragile and unstable. But when Jesus saw him, He renamed him *Peter*—meaning "rock."

#### **Scripture Focus:**

"Jesus looked at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John. You will be called Cephas' (which, when translated, is Peter)." – *John 1:42 (NIV)*

#### **Reflection Activity:**

- Write your birth name and what it means.
- Ask the Holy Spirit in prayer: *What do You call me?*
- Write the spiritual name or identity you sense God calling you.

### ***The Supernatural You***

#### **Core Truth:**

Your true self is revealed in Christ—not in culture, trauma, or tradition.

#### **Scripture Focus:**

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has gone, the new is here!" – *2 Corinthians 5:17 (NIV)*

#### **Activity:**

Draw a line down a sheet of paper. On one side, list the labels the world or others gave you (e.g., failure, fearful, unworthy). On the other side, list what God says about you (e.g., victorious, fearless, beloved). Pray over them.

### ***Fellowship that Unveils Purpose***

#### **Core Truth:**

Going to church is not enough. Relationship births revelation.

**Scripture Focus:**

“Call to me and I will answer you and tell you great and unsearchable things you do not know.” – *Jeremiah 33:3 (NIV)*

“My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me.” – *John 10:27 (NIV)*

**Discussion Prompt:**

- Do you just attend church or do you commune with Christ daily?
- How has God spoken to you recently?

**Action Step:**

Set aside 15 minutes daily this week for solitude, reading the Word, and journaling what you sense God is saying.

***You Are More Than This – Rise in Purpose***

**Core Truth:**

You are not weak or accidental. You are a chosen vessel with a divine assignment.

**Scripture Focus:**

“But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God’s special possession...” – *1 Peter 2:9 (NIV)*

**Activity:**

Research and share one biblical character who rose in purpose despite their humble or flawed beginning (e.g., David, Gideon, Esther).

***Rise Like Peter – Step Out and Lead***

**Peter’s Result:**

Once he embraced his divine name, Peter led boldly, preached powerfully, and became a pillar of the early Church.

**Scripture Focus:**

“But Peter, standing up with the eleven, raised his voice and said to them...” – *Acts 2:14 (NKJV)*

“I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.” – *Philippians 4:13 (NKJV)*

**Action:**

Create a “Kingdom Impact Plan”:

1. What is one area God is calling you to lead in?
2. What are three first steps you can take?
3. Who can hold you accountable?

***Final Charge – You Are the Rock!***

**Core Truth:**

When you rise in your God-given identity, you become unstoppable.

**Scripture Focus:**

“Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid... for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go.” – *Joshua 1:9 (NIV)*

**Reflection:**

Like Peter, your transformation begins at the feet of Jesus. When He calls you the rock, believe it, walk in it, and lead others to discover the same.

**Closing Prayer:**

Lord, open my ears to hear my new name. Let me rise like Peter, walk like Jesus, and lead with power. Amen.

**WHEN YOU KNOW – THE TRANSFORMING POWER OF REVELATION KNOWLEDGE**

***Objective:***

To help believers move from superficial understanding of God's Word to deep, transformational revelation that brings true freedom and leadership effectiveness.

***The Foundation of True Freedom***

**Key Scripture:**

*“And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.”* – John 8:32 (KJV)

**Overview:**

Jesus addressed the Pharisees, who were religious yet still bound. Like them, many today go to church, know Bible verses, yet live defeated lives—trapped by poverty, sickness, fear, and confusion.

**Learning Outcome:**

Participants will understand the difference between intellectual knowledge and revelation knowledge.

**Activity:**

- Reflective journaling: Write down areas in your life where you know the Word but haven't seen results. Why do you think this is so?

***Beyond Head Knowledge – From Information to Revelation***

**Key Scripture:**

*“The entrance of thy words giveth light; it giveth understanding unto the simple.”* – Psalm 119:130 (KJV)

**Overview:**

The Pharisees were scholars, yet lacked spiritual insight. Revelation knowledge is when truth penetrates the heart and becomes part of your subconscious. This is when miracles begin.

**Illustration:**

Just as you don't need to remind yourself to breathe—when the Word becomes flesh, it flows effortlessly.

**Learning Outcome:**

Students will learn how to transition from reading the Word to internalizing it until it bears fruit.

**Activity:**

- Scripture meditation: Pick one Bible verse. Meditate on it daily for a week and write what insights or changes emerge.

***Living the Word – The Evidence of True Knowledge***

**Key Scripture:**

*“But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves.”* – James 1:22 (KJV)

**Overview:**

Satan is not afraid of your Bible study or church attendance—he fears the believer who acts on revelation. The difference between defeat and victory is doing the Word.

**Learning Outcome:**

Participants will evaluate how much of the Word they are living versus just knowing.

**Activity:**

- Role-play: In small groups, act out real-life scenarios and apply the Word practically.
- Group discussion: Share a moment when applying God's Word changed a situation for you.

***Deep Roots for Great Results***

**Key Scripture:**

*“Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly... But his delight is in the law of the Lord; and in his law doth he meditate day and night.”* – Psalm 1:1–2 (KJV)

**Overview:**

Miracles don't happen because you shout "Hallelujah" loudest. They happen because the Word has taken root and transformed your thinking, speaking, and actions.

**Illustration:**

A mango tree does not struggle to produce fruit when it is well rooted. So is the life of a believer who lives by revelation.

**Learning Outcome:**

Participants will learn the necessity of consistency in the Word and meditation as a lifestyle.

**Activity:**

- Memory verse challenge: Memorize one powerful scripture per week and share how it changed your thinking.
- Create a "Word Habit Plan" for daily personal transformation.

**Conclusion:**

Don't settle for a Pharisee-level of knowledge. Let the Word take root and shape your actions until you become a living testimony. That's when you become a transformational leader—free, fruitful, and a world changer.

**Final Scripture:**

*"If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed."* – John 8:31 (KJV)

**Assignment:**

Write a personal declaration of freedom based on truths you've internalized from this course. Share your declaration with a trusted group member or mentor.

## 34

### A SHIFT IN YOUR UNDERSTANDING OF FULL-TIME MINISTRY

#### ***Introduction: Rethinking Full-Time Ministry***

Many have adopted the term *full-time ministry* without fully embracing its weight. In some cases, it becomes a cover for idleness, rather than a call to intentional, purpose-driven living for God. This course invites you to rediscover full-time ministry not as a position or a pulpit title, but as a lifestyle wholly committed to the will and work of God in every sphere of life.

#### **Scripture:**

*“Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men.” – Colossians 3:23*

#### ***Meeting Needs as Good Stewards***

A true minister is a faithful steward. Ministry is not loitering; it is meeting needs and managing time wisely. Every hour is an opportunity to serve God and others.

**Key Principle:** Accountability is a proof of faithfulness.

#### **Scripture:**

*“Moreover, it is required in stewards that one be found faithful.” – 1 Corinthians 4:2*

#### **Activity:**

List the top 5 needs in your local community. How can you or your ministry begin to meet at least one of them intentionally this month?

#### ***Beyond the Pulpit – A Life Dedicated to God***

True full-time ministry is not restricted to preaching. Look at the examples of:

- **Joseph** – Administered resources during famine (Genesis 41).
- **Daniel** – Influenced Babylon through wisdom and integrity (Daniel 6).
- **Mother Teresa & Mary Slessor** – Served the helpless with compassion.

- **David Livingstone** – Opened Africa to both missions and development.

**Scripture:**

*“Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.” – Matthew 5:16*

**Activity:**

Reflect on your career or field. How can your current role become a platform for kingdom service?

***Being People of Many Parts***

A true minister must be versatile. The call to ministry often includes educational empowerment, healthcare, business, policy influence, and family mentorship.

**Scripture:**

*“To the weak I became as weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people...” – 1 Corinthians 9:22*

**Activity:**

Identify 3 skills or areas outside preaching that you can develop to influence your society positively.

***A Paradigm Shift in Understanding Ministry***

Ministry includes every assignment done in God’s name and for His glory. Paul made tents to support himself (Acts 18:3). Earning income is not a betrayal of calling; neglecting family or purpose is.

**Scripture:**

*“If anyone does not provide for his relatives... he has denied the faith...” – 1 Timothy 5:8*

**Activity:**

Review your daily routine. Where is your time being lost? Create a new schedule that includes family, ministry, work, rest, and personal growth.

### ***Augmenting Finances and Responsible Stewardship***

Ministers must think beyond offerings. Learn from Paul. Don't despise small beginnings or multiple income streams. Money isn't your ministry, but it sustains the mission.

**Scripture:**

*“The Lord commanded that those who proclaim the gospel should get their living by the gospel.”  
– 1 Corinthians 9:14*

**Activity:**

List 3 simple businesses or value-added services you can launch without compromising your calling.

### ***Making the Best Use of Time***

Each day is 24 hours. How you allocate it reveals your priorities. Ministry doesn't eliminate family or rest—it balances them.

**Scripture:**

*“Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom.” – Psalm 90:12*

**Activity:**

Time-audit your last 3 days. Where did most of your time go? How can you realign your schedule for kingdom efficiency?

### ***Avoiding Waste and Embracing Purpose***

Jesus said, “Gather the fragments...” (John 6:12). Even miracles must be stewarded. The parable of the talents teaches us that God despises waste and celebrates productivity.

**Scripture:**

*“Well done, good and faithful servant...” – Matthew 25:21*

**Activity:**

Identify a gift or skill you've neglected. Create an action plan to develop or deploy it in service to God's people.

***Conclusion: An Acceptable Sacrifice***

Full-time ministry is about *total life surrender*. It's about living with purpose, integrity, responsibility, and excellence in all areas. When your life becomes an offering, then your ministry becomes an *acceptable sacrifice*.

**Scripture:**

*"Present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service."*  
– Romans 12:1

**Final Activity:**

Write a personal mission statement that reflects your understanding of full-time ministry and your next steps to live it out daily.

**THE PREDICTABILITY OF GOD – FINDING BLESSINGS IN OBEDIENCE**

**Objective:** To equip Christian leaders with a deeper understanding of God's consistent nature and to develop obedience as a foundational principle for experiencing divine blessings.

***The Predictable Nature of God***

**Key Idea:**

God is not random or erratic. He operates within patterns and principles established from the beginning of creation. Just as “a goat never births a cock,” God's order in nature reflects His order in leadership and life.

**Scripture:**

- *Numbers 23:19* – “God is not a man, that he should lie, nor a son of man, that he should change his mind...”

**Discussion Prompt:**

- Reflect on natural laws you see in the world. How do they mirror God’s spiritual laws?

**Activity:**

- Create a two-column chart. One side: Natural patterns (e.g., day follows night). Other side: Spiritual patterns (e.g., obedience brings blessing). Present to a small group.

***Obedience as a Pathway to Blessing***

**Key Idea:**

The promises of God are often conditional—activated by obedience. His blessings are predictable when we follow His commands.

**Scriptures:**

- *Deuteronomy 28:1-2* – “If you fully obey the Lord your God... all these blessings will come upon you...”

**Key Idea:**

To lead like God leads, you must be dependable and consistent. Your followers will only trust a leader whose character reflects divine patterns.

**Scripture:**

**Discussion Prompt:**

- As a leader, are you predictable in your values and actions? Where do you need to grow?

**Activity:**

- Create a “leadership values compass” to guide your decisions consistently, modelled after God's attributes.

***Embracing Obedience for Long-Term Impact***

**Key Idea:**

Obedience is not transactional—it’s transformational. It's not just about what you get, but who you become.

**Scriptures:**

- *John 14:15* – “If you love me, keep my commands.”
- *Isaiah 1:19* – “If you are willing and obedient, you will eat the good of the land.”

**Activity:**

- Write a personal “obedience testimony.” Where has God honored your obedience, even if the reward came much later?

**Leadership Reflection:**

- Design a plan to model obedience in one area of your leadership this month. Track the outcomes.

***Summary: Anchoring in God’s Predictability***

God’s unchanging nature is not a limitation—it’s an invitation. As you align with His Word and walk in obedience, you position yourself as a channel for His blessings. Predictable obedience leads to predictable favour. This is the secret weapon of every great Christian leader.

**Final Scripture:**

Value-Centric Leadership.

**WHAT TO DO WHEN THE VISION TARRIES**

***Christian Leadership Series – Advanced Level***

Course Overview

This course is designed to equip aspiring and seasoned Christian leaders with the spiritual insight, patience, and perseverance needed to navigate seasons of waiting. Drawing wisdom from biblical examples and deep scriptural reflections, participants will learn how to trust God’s timing and remain steadfast until their God-given visions are fulfilled.

***The Appointed Time – Trusting God's Timing***

**Key Scripture:**

*Habakkuk 2:3 (KJV)* – “For the vision is yet for an appointed time, but at the end it shall speak, and not lie: though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry.”

Core Concepts:

- Every vision has a God-ordained time.
- Premature actions can ruin divine purposes.
- Waiting is an act of faith, not passivity.

Activity:

**"Vision Board Timeline"**

- Create a personal vision board. Identify promises or dreams from God that are yet to manifest. Write down what season you believe you are in (Preparation, Test, Waiting, or Fulfillment) and find a scripture to hold onto during this season.

### ***Joseph – Patience in the Pit and the Palace***

#### **Key Scripture:**

*Genesis 37–41 (selected verses)*

*Romans 8:28* – “And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God...”

#### Core Concepts:

- Joseph was gifted but had to wait for his gift to be received at the right time.
- Challenges didn't disqualify him; they prepared him.

#### Illustration:

Joseph, though betrayed, enslaved, and imprisoned, stayed faithful. Like a seed in the soil, his vision was buried before it bloomed.

#### Activity:

##### **"From Pit to Palace Map"**

- Draw or list Joseph's journey. Note each season and identify personal parallels in your life. Journal one way God may be using current challenges to prepare you.

### ***David – Anointed but Not Yet Appointed***

#### **Key Scripture:**

*1 Samuel 16–2 Samuel 5*

*Psalms 27:14* – “Wait on the Lord: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart...”

#### Core Concepts:

- David was anointed king but spent years fleeing.
- God uses waiting to build character and humility.

#### Activity:

##### **"The Wilderness Season Reflection"**

- Read Psalm 27. Write a reflection about a “wilderness” period in your life. What did you learn? What did God reveal about Himself and you?

### ***The Power of Process***

#### **Key Scripture:**

*Isaiah 40:30-31*

*James 1:4 (NIV)* – “Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything.”

#### Core Concepts:

- The waiting season is a refining process.
- Rushing out of God’s process leads to broken outcomes.
- Endurance builds leadership capacity.

#### Illustration:

A butterfly that exits its cocoon too soon will never fly. Strength comes from enduring the process.

#### Activity:

#### **"Cocoon vs. Wings Exercise"**

- Write down 3 “waiting pains” and 3 “potential gains” God may be developing in you. Discuss in small groups or pairs.

### ***Strength for the Wait***

*Philippians 1:6* – “Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform it...”

#### Core Concepts:

- God is a finisher. He completes what He starts.
- Spiritual strength is renewed in the secret place of prayer and study.

#### Activity:

#### **"Waiting Warrior Devotional Plan"**

- Begin a 7-day devotional focusing on God’s faithfulness during seasons of waiting. Include prayers, declarations, and reflections.

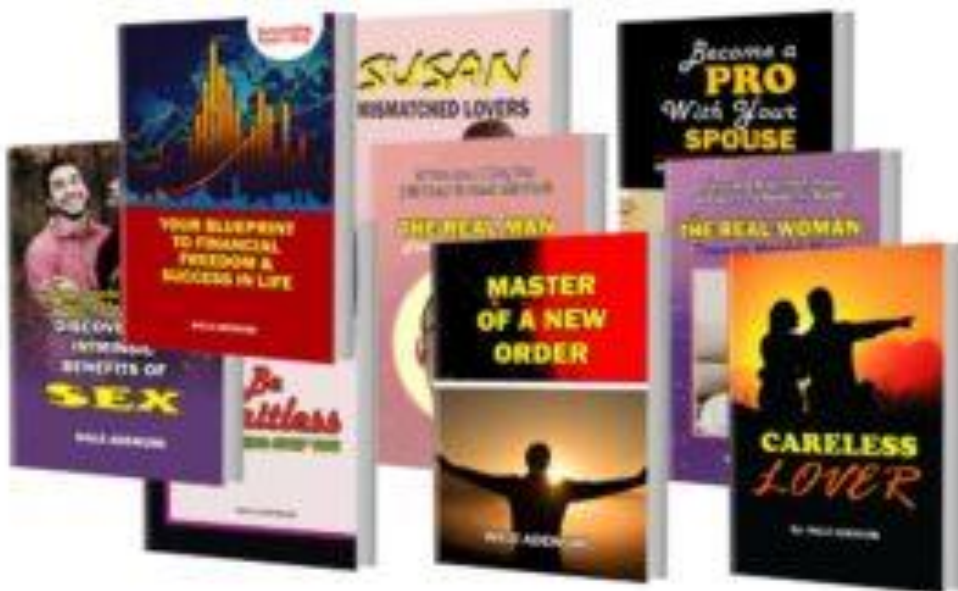
